The Ohio Council of Library and Information Services (OCLIS) awards small grants in support of its goals. OCLIS exists primarily to further communication and collaboration among Ohio groups involved in library and information work. Therefore, projects seeking to communicate ideas and to support the field or of individual groups within the field may qualify for grants.
